

As with all schools across Wales, we are continuing to develop our new [Curriculum for Wales](#), which began its implementation in September 2022.

We will continue to post further information on our Curriculum for Wales provision over the months ahead.

Teachers throughout the school are planning the knowledge, skills and experiences that children will access, together with other aspects of the curriculum such as cross-cutting themes (e.g. human rights, RSE, careers). Much of the curriculum will be provided through cross-curricula themes and children are encouraged to identify areas they wish to know more about. A variety of teaching methods are employed to encourage children to become independent learners, and children are given opportunities to study through a range of whole class, groups, paired and individual activities.

Most of our teaching is done through the medium of English. However, Welsh is taught in all classes including use of incidental Welsh throughout the school. Children are encouraged to speak Welsh with their peers and other adults, supported by a structured progression of words and phrases. Welsh Language is promoted in classes through literature and display. Welsh songs and prayers feature in assemblies and displays highlight relevant Welsh phrases and words. We give children the opportunity to experience Welsh culture and heritage wherever possible.
